

The regular monthly meeting of the Jarratt Town Council was held on Tuesday, September 12, 2017, at 7:00 P.M., at the Town Municipal Building. Members present Cecil McCoy, James M. Wyche, Annie Peavy, Omar Smith, M. B. Rideout and Roderic Tuell. Mayor Kenneth Warf absent.

The meeting was called to order by Council President Cecil McCoy.

Prayer was led by Council member James M. Wyche.

Agenda

Mr. Wyche made the motion to accept the agenda with the discussion of the Golf Cart Ordinance to be added under Public Health, Safety and Welfare, seconded by Mrs. Annie Peavy. Motion carried.

Minutes

Roderic Tuell made the motion to accept the minutes, seconded by Omar Smith. Motion carried.

Citizen Comments

Donald Baylor from the National Coalition for Public Safety, who is currently a retired correctional officer, addressed Council and residents on the shortage of Correctional Officers in the state of Virginia, but in particular in the nearby Greensville Correctional Center. Being understaffed causes concerns for employee safety and the community. Mr. Baylor asked that we encourage employees of the Department of Correction and give them a listening ear. Mr. Baylor asked that we support our local Delegate Representative Rosalyn Tyler as she pushes for cost of living raise for these employees during the General Assembly.

Resident Pauline Adams says that there are big problems in the Town of Jarratt. Mrs. Adams had a change of heart about saving Johns Manville Clubhouse and is no longer in favor of.

Resident Wayne Veliky asked Council exactly who is responsible for the water issue at 117 Jarratt Avenue. The Council stated the situation is still being reviewed, however Council is looking for a solution.
